Dispatchers keep all school bus drivers, aides and department personnel updated on routes and student information for seven M-DCPS transportation centers, maintaining daily logs and tracking all school buses in real time, as well as assigning stand-by school bus drivers to unoccupied routes and keeping parents updated on bus delays. They are responsible for all school bus emergency communications and dispatch medical assistance to accident sites as needed.
